

Aesculapius Guidelines for Students in Receipt of Elective Bursaries

The Sands Cox Charity is very pleased to support students during their elective studies.

Recipients of a bursary from the Sands Cox Charity are under an obligation to:

- a) Give a 10 minute presentation on your elective at the Sands Cox Lecture and AGM held in the Autumn. Buffet lunch will be provided.
- b) Submit a short paper (up to 1500 words) describing, in outline, their studies and a short account of their travels for publication in Aesculapius, the annual Journal of the Charity. Please keep your title short. If necessary use a title and subtitle. Your paper will be edited and any queries referred to you.

Previous bursary holders have found it convenient to use parts of their compulsory elective report for this purpose plus some short personal travelogue.

It is not appropriate to submit the whole of the compulsory report for Aesculapius. References are not required but 3 pictures are welcome

Pictures should be of high quality and submitted by email. Please remember that if you use published pictures from magazines or appliance literature you must confirm that you have sought permission for them to be reproduced.

If your report is a Word document and contains embedded charts or images please supply them separately as well.

Text, preferably in Word format, should be submitted by email to the Editor Dr Keith Harding (Ikeithharding@gmail.com & cc: info@sandscoxcharity.uk). Such a paper counts as a publication and can usefully be quoted in a CV.

The strict deadline for the receipt of the paper is 31 December. Papers received after this date will be rejected and not published.
