## Aesculapius - Guidelines for papers and letters

## **Background**

Aesculapius was the Roman god of Medicine. The Journal Aesculapius is published annually and circulated to the Birmingham doctors and dentists who are members of the Sands Cox Charity- named after the founder of the Birmingham Medical School. Most members live in or around Birmingham but others are further away with some overseas members. In addition, medical and dental students are given a copy of the Journal.

The Journal contains Medical or Dental articles including reports of student elective periods sponsored by the Sands Cox Charity. In addition, there are articles about places of interest or historical importance in and around Birmingham, reports of reunions and obituary notices.

## **Submissions**

**Papers** should be <u>up to</u> 2000 words long and may contain 3 illustrations. It is usually not appropriate to give references. Any submissions outside these guidelines must be agreed with an Editor.

Articles should be sent by email to the editor. If your report is a Word document and contains embedded charts or images please supply them separately as well, with their legends in the text.

Any significant changes made by the editor will be sent to the author for agreement before the paper is published.

We publish annually in June and each copy must reach me by the end of December at the latest.
